### The Inside Scoop

It's been said that there are a finite number of plots in the world. I suspect that's true. But human beings have been telling stories since we could communicate. So, why aren't we all bored silly by now?

My guess is that we still want stories because of the characters. We are insatiably interested in the life stories of other people. Don't get me wrong, the plot is important, but readers have to care about the characters if we want the story to stick.

So, the challenge is to create characters that people want to spend time with. That's especially important for protagonists, since we want readers to root for our main characters, to worry for them, to celebrate with them, to struggle and triumph or fail with them.

My early versions of Zee missed the mark. Although I didn't mean to make her so, she was too foolish, and she often came across as weak. Critique readers kept urging me to make her smarter and stronger. Since I wanted Zee to develop throughout the book, and the series, my challenge was to make her competent and likable, but also flawed so she had room to grow.

I hope I did that. I'm definitely enjoying Zee's continued growth arc in book two. Characters who grow are more fun to spend time with, for writers as well as readers.
