## Meet My Village – Sin City Writers Group





## The Great Pastry Hunt

Pineapple Sunshine Cake w Coconut



Okay, this isn't technically pastry, but when I tasted this cake at our community Father's Day potluck, I had to feature it. On a typically hot Las Vegas day, this dessert was moist and lightly sweet, actually refreshing. Every bite was infused with the bright juiciness of fresh pineapple and augmented by chewy coconut. The tropics in my mouth!

The sunny yellow cake doesn't need the frosting, but unlike some toppings, this one complements the cake without overpowering it. It's whipped, so it's light, and it boasts a surprise ingredient, vanilla pudding. That gives it a richness without weighing it down. The frosting also gets a touch of pineapple. It's crowned with toasted coconut for the perfect finish.
