The Great Pastry Hunt: Apple Tart



This year, a neighbor brought this delicious tart to our annual New Year's Eve open house. I liked so much, I asked her for the recipe. She told me she bought it at Trader Joe's!

As I usually do, I tasted the crust first. The edges are biscuit-like, not too sweet, the perfect base for those large sugar crystals. The bottom crust is delightfully NOT soggy—my continual problem with pies I try to make. It's firm and fully up to the task of containing all the juicy apple slices.

The filling is chock full of apples, firm and bursting with fresh tart-sweet flavor. I can find nary a speck of gelatinous filling. For a final touch, the sprinkle of sliced almonds on top adds a nutty richness and crunch.

I ate this for breakfast with a slice of cheddar. Perfect. Zee may have to buy one of these, but I wonder how long it will last in her refrigerator.
